




# FSA ID How-To Guide

**Creating an FSA ID is the first step in completing the FAFSA**

## What is an FSA ID?

The Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID is a **username** and **password** that is required to log in and access all Federal Student Aid websites, including the **FAFSA**. The FSA ID also serves as a **legal signature** when you submit your FAFSA



Go to [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) and click **“create account: in the upper right hand corner. The application is available in English and Spanish.**

## Who should create an FSA ID?

**You** and **one or both of your parents** must create an FSA ID **before** completing the FAFSA. If you are an independent student, you will not need to have your parent or legal guardian create an FSA ID. If you have a sibling who attended college before you, your parent may already have an FSA ID.




Starting in Winter 2023, every person contributing information to a FAFSA will need an FSA ID - **including parents who do not have a social security number**



If you are a student without a social security number, you will not be able to create a FSA ID or complete the FAFSA. See a financial aid counselor or email [financialaid@lamar.edu](mailto:financialaid@lamar.edu) to learn more about financial aid opportunities that may be available to you.


## What information do I need to create an FSA ID?

- Full name and social security number, as they appear on social security card (if applicable)
- Date of birth
- Valid email address & phone number
- Immediate access to your email account
- Your residential address



**Save your FSA ID username and password somewhere safe.**

## FSA ID How-To Guide: Application Process

**Mobile Phone Account Access**

We strongly recommend setting up your mobile phone for account access. This option helps you gain access to your account if you are locked out, as well as allows your mobile phone to be used for two-step verification.



- Create a password that you don't use for other accounts.

### How do I make the challenge questions?

You will need to select four challenge questions from a dropdown list and provide answers. If you forget your username or password, you may need to answer the challenge questions to access your account.

- Select how you would like the Department of Education (the people who manage the FAFSA) to communicate with you, and in what language (English or Spanish)
- We recommend email to get communications quickly
- Set up two-step verification for your FSA ID with your phone number, email, and/or authenticator app
- We recommend setting up all methods so you have multiple options to log in

**Communication Preferences**

**Required Communications**

The U.S. Department of Education (ED) and its federal student loan servicers will need to send you required communications and documents related to your federal student aid, such as student loan disclosures and interest statements.

**Enable Two-Step Verification**

**Protect Your Account with Two-Step Verification**

Whenever you sign in, we'll send a secure code to make sure it's really you. To keep your account protected, make sure your phone number and email are verified. We also suggest setting up verification using a secure authenticator app.

# FSA ID How-To Guide: Additional Steps for Contributors without Social Security Numbers (SSN)

**Remember that you should only create an FSA ID without an SSN if you are either:**

- A parent or spouse of a student completing the FAFSA
- A citizen of the Freely Associated States (the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, and the Republic of Palau) and need to complete the FAFSA

## What is identity verification?

If you do not have an SSN you need to confirm your identity through a series of questions at the end of the account creation process. The personal information from these questions comes from the TransUnion Credit Bureau, but this is not a credit check.

You will have one chance to answer the questions correctly, or you will need to confirm your identity through an alternative process

#### Identity Verification

One last step! We're required to ask additional questions when you don't have a Social Security number (SSN) to verify your identity. You must answer these to finish creating your account.

The results of the identity verification will be displayed on the next page--note that you won't be able to return to this page to answer these questions again.


- This screen will appear if your identity was not able to be verified
- You will need to contact FSA at 1-800-433-3243 to initiate a manual identity verification process
- You will need to complete the Attestation Form and provide documentation that proves your identity.

## Is the personal information I provide protected?

According to the National College Attainment Network, "federal law prohibits the use of data collected through the FAFSA for anything other than calculating federal and state financial aid. Entities with access to this data are also required to protect the data against security threats or unauthorized uses. FSA [the Office of Federal Student Aid] will not share FAFSA information with anyone except the schools the student indicates they want to attend... as well as a few federal and state government agencies (so they can check to be sure the information is accurate or determine financial aid eligibility)." Enable Two-Step Verification: Backup Code

**i** Store your backup code somewhere safe.

Your backup code lets you access your account in the event that you cannot use any other two-step verification method. If for some reason you misplace or cannot access your backup code, you will be able to generate a new backup code in your account settings.

- Enable the secure backup code, which will help you access your account if the other verification methods won't work
- Make note of your backup code and store it somewhere safe

**Now that you created your FSA ID, your information must be verified and matched with the Social Security Administration (if you provided a social security number).**

### When can I use my FSA ID?

If you provided an SSN, your FSA ID won't be fully functional until you receive an email in a few days about your SSA match. Likewise, if you do not have an SSN and need to go through the manual identity verification process, your FSA ID won't be fully functional until 1-3 days after submitting your documents. You can still use your FSA ID immediately to access your [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) account dashboard, and start or contribute your information to a FAFSA.

### Can I edit my FSA ID?

**Yes.** If your personal information changes or you would like to update anything on your account, you can make changes by logging in at [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) and selecting "settings" under your account information.

### What if I forget my FSA ID username or password?

You can retrieve your username or reset your password by having a secure code sent to your phone/email. You may also answer your challenge questions, but this option comes with a 30-minute waiting period before you can use your account again.

### What do I do if I need help?
