Global Perspectives

The Department of Deaf Studies & Deaf Education is proud to introduce two international graduate students: Francis Mbisso and Cristophorus Budidharma

Meet Francis! Francis is from Tanzania, where he received his Bachelors degree. Completing his degree proved to be difficult, because he was the only Deaf member of his class, and resources for Deaf individuals were limited.

Post-graduation, Francis, began teaching high school level accounting classes, which eventually became a nine year career in education.

Interested in pursuing the discipline of Deaf Studies and Deaf Education, Francis decided to travel abroad and obtain his Master's degree at the Rochester Institute of Technology. "I wanted to show my country that Deaf people CAN do everything. You can have a great education as a Deaf student," says Francis.

During his time at the Rochester Institute of Technology, Francis met David Meek, a Visiting Assistant Professor and Alumni of Lamar University. It was through David Meek that Francis found Lamar University. Francis explained that after meeting with some of the Lamar faculty, he knew that he would be in good hands. "I can be involved and have access all of the time," he explains. The Department has designated interpreters, Deaf faculty, and ensures access for all of their students. The University also provides many opportunities and options for international students. "The program really supports international students. It's not easy studying abroad. But Lamar offers tuition waivers, graduate assistant opportunities, and more," says Francis.

Francis is now pursuing his Ed.D. in Deaf Studies and Deaf Education.

Post-graduation, Francis plans to return home to Tanzania and work alongside the government. Upon returning home to Tanzania, Francis will be the only Deaf individual in the entire country to have a doctoral degree. He hopes to use this to his advantage to advocate for better resources and access for other Deaf students in his home country. "I have friends and professors here in the USA, but I have an entire community back in Tanzania that I can support," he says.

Francis plans to stay in contact with the Lamar University faculty and help build a connection between the two countries for research and presentation opportunities.



Meet Cristo! Cristo is from Indonesia and originally had dreams of pursuing an education in medicine. Cristo fought for over a year to pursue a degree in Biology and Chemistry, because Cristo was always told Cristo couldn't because Cristo was Deaf. During Cristo's time in school, sign language interpreters were not always available, and even if they were, "they're all volunteers," Cristo explained. The lack of access made it extremely difficult, but nonetheless, Cristo succeeded. To finish Cristo's degree, Cristo looked for options outside of Indonesia. After extensive research, time and energy spent, Cristo found a good match.

Cristo, like Francis, also attended the Rochester **Institute of Technology.** "It was my first time in the USA. I was surprised to see Deaf Professors that had their Ph.D., Deaf physicians, Deaf lawyers, certified and trained sign language interpreters; we don't have any of that in Indonesia," says Cristo. "It's amazing that Deaf Americans have this level of access, because it's not common in other countries."

Cristo graduated from RIT, Magna Cum Laude, with his Bachelors's degree in Biomedical Sciences. Post-graduation, Cristo looked for job opportunities, but was overlooked for others with graduate degrees. Cristo ended up having to return to Indonesia. For five years Cristo searched for scholarship opportunities and graduate programs in the USA with little luck. About to give

up, Cristo had a friend do a tarot reading. During this reading, the tarot reader explained that Cristo was too focused on Anatomy and the medical field. "The tarot reader said, 'All the scholarships out there are for YOU, but not for Anatomy." The tarot reader explained that in two to three months, someone would reach out with a scholarship opportunity for a Master program that leads into a Doctoral program. And funnily enough, three months later, he was approached by a Lamar University professor, Sean Hauschildt, with a scholarship opportunity for the graduate program in the Department of Deaf Studies & Deaf Education. "Sometimes the universe just knows," says Cristo.

After finishing Cristo's Master program, Cristo plans to join the Doctoral program in the Department. Cristo's future goals include becoming an educator and role model in Indonesia with the goal of increasing the number of scholars in the Deaf community. When Cristo returns to Indonesia, Cristo will be one of three Deaf individuals with a Doctoral degree. Cristo also hopes to set up a foundation for the Deaf children of Indonesia so they can have access to a high-quality education.

We are so proud of both of these wonderful students. Thank you both for choosing Lamar University. It can be difficult to be away from your home country, but just know that you always have a home in the College of Fine Arts & Communication.

Labs to Leadership

Meet Andrea! Andrea Galindo is a graduate student in the Department of Speech & Hearing Sciences, pursuing her Doctor of Audiology.

Originally from McAllen, Texas, Andrea received her B.S. in Communication Sciences and Disorders from University of Texas – Rio Grande Valley. After completing her bachelor's degree, she knew she wanted to continue to graduate school, but she wanted to stay in Texas, making Lamar University a perfect fit. "It was difficult to be somewhere you've never been before," says Andrea. "Luckily, I have a friend from the University of Texas – Rio Grande Valley who started the program here at Lamar University with me. It was nice to know at least one person so I wouldn't feel quite so alone in this new town."

Andrea has completed a variety of research projects during her time here at Lamar. One of her favorite projects involved researching the FNIRS cap, which is used to measure changes in hemodynamics. Their research involved using this technology to determine the correlation of blood pressure and inner ear-motion sickness. This research was presented at the NASA Expo.


Her new research project involves the P300 test; which measures brainwaves. The goal of this project is to test musicians and see if they can notice slight sound changes, due to their extensive training, and if that reflects in their brainwayes.

During her time at Lamar University, Andrea has worked in the Department of Speech & Hearing Sciences under the direction of Dr. Lilian Felipe, Associate Professor, Dr. Raul Prezas, Associate Professor, and Alexandra Simeonides-Bernard, Administrative Coordinator. "It's nice to see how the Dean works and how he establishes relationships with others. He's set an example of what it means to be a leader. I want to be like him," says Andrea. 
