Follow us for advice, and feel free to contact us with questions about how to facilitate these conversations or any other questions you may have!




Week of Welcome starts on August 18th when students move in and continues through August 27th!

CLOCKWORK

Certain times in the academic year tend to be universally challenging to students. Understanding the ups and downs of the first college year is essential for open and honest conversations that help students navigate these challenging times.

August - In August, students are excited and ready for this new chapter of their lives! They are exploring campus and meeting new people.

Ask Your Cardinal: What has been your favorite Week of Welcome event? Have you found where all of your classes are this semester?

September - After Week of Welcome, students may feel homesick or lonely. Students may also be experiencing anxiety about finances, roommates, classes, and professors.

Ask Your Cardinal: Do you have a budget or financial plan?

October - In the middle of October students take their midterms, which is their first major exam of the semester. Later this month, students meet with their Academic Advisor about classes they will take next semester.

Ask Your Cardinal: Have you viewed your Degree Audit online? What classes do you want to take next semester?

November - At this times, students have usually settled into campus and have found their footing. However, many students still struggle with time management conflicts between social and school obligations.

Ask Your Cardinal: How did you do on your Midterm Exams?

December - In December, students have anxiety about their final exams for classes. Students also have mixed emotions regarding going home for winter break!

Ask Your Cardinal: How do you feel about leaving campus for winter break?
